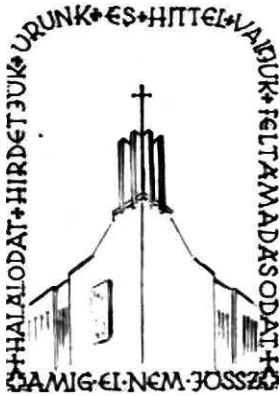

It is possible to sign up for more hours. “Officially”, we need 2 or 3 persons for every hour. The days for 2012 are: Oct. 3, Nov. 7, and Dec. 5.

**A letter from our Archbishop, Card. Collins**

On October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2011, Pope Benedict XVI announced a “**Year of Faith**” that would be observed by the universal Church beginning in October 2012. Throughout his pontificate, the Holy Father has expressed his concern with the decline in faith in so many Christian nations, as well as the many challenges that the Church faces in proclaiming her faith. As he described in his Apostolic Letter, *Porta Fidei*, the Year of Faith will be a time to address the “**profound crisis of faith** that has affected many people.” The Year of Faith will officially commence on October 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012, in order to coincide with the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council and the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. Thus, a major part of the Year of Faith will be to study and ponder the documents of Vatican II and the Catechism in order to deepen our knowledge of the content of faith “that for centuries has formed the heritage of all believers.” (*Porta Fidei*) The Year will conclude on November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2013, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King.

In the Archdiocese of Toronto, plans are underway to celebrate the Year of Faith both at the diocesan and parish levels. Our committee, chaired by Bishop Vincent Nguyen, will provide further information in the fall and throughout the year.

At present, attached you will find some highlights for consideration that you may wish to note at this time.

I draw particular attention the Solemn Opening Mass for the Year of Faith that I will celebrate on Sunday, October 14, 2012 at 4 p.m. at St. Paul's Basilica. I encourage all parishes to send representatives and, in particular, I would ask that lay pastoral associates, youth ministers and others involved in key ministry roles be encouraged to attend.

We ask that you dialogue with your parish council and staff to find creative ways to make the Year of Faith known in your parish community. To assist your efforts, two posters will be included in our next pouch mailing and we will also provide a dedicated online space [www.archtoronto.org/faith](http://www.archtoronto.org/faith) to be launched shortly.

In the words of Pope Benedict XVI, the Year "will be a moment of grace and commitment for an ever fuller conversion to God, to strengthen our faith in him and to proclaim him with joy to the people of our time."

### **Year of Faith – Noteworthy Events & Activities**

#### • **Solemn Opening Mass for the Year of Faith**

- Sunday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2012 - 4:00 p.m., St. Paul's Basilica
  - Main Celebrant: His Eminence Thomas Cardinal Collins
  - Encourage participation from all parishes especially parish catechists and ministry leaders.

#### • **Witnesses of Faith**

- Sunday, October 21<sup>st</sup>, 2012 – Canonization of 7 new saints, including Bl. Kateri Tekakwitha, Bl. Marianne Cope of New York, and Bl. Pedro Calungsod of the Philippines. Although the ceremony will be in Rome, we encourage you to make it known and even celebrated in your parishes.
- Relics of Canadian Saints – The Martyrs Shrine in Midland will make available a reliquary of the Canadian Martyrs to travel throughout the Archdiocese. St. Joseph's Oratory in Montreal is also able to provide relics of St. Andre Bessette. Parishes can request these relics, which will also be accompanied by a catechetical presentation on the saints.

#### • **Catechesis and Faith Formation**

- The Office of Formation for Discipleship will offer a variety of workshops for parishioners around the Archdiocese. These will include an 8-part series "Exploring the Catechism: Faith

Alive!", a 6-part series on the "Basic Teachings of the Catholic Church", and a 10-part series "Catholicism" of Fr. Robert Barron. A catalogue describing all offerings in detail has been sent to parishes. You can also find details online at:

- Office of Catholic Youth – Catechetical event /programs for Youth & Young Adults will be organized regionally. These will focus the youth on the *Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church* and the *YouCat* (Youth Catechism).

#### • **June 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2013 – Feast of Corpus Christi**

- Regional Eucharistic processions will be organized; parishes to collaborate with Regional Bishop's office.
- Parishes are also encouraged to have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, as this will be done worldwide in union with the Holy Father in Rome.

#### • **Pilgrimages within the Archdiocese of Toronto**

- Faithful are encouraged to make pilgrimages within the Archdiocese. Some possible locations:
  - Shrines (e.g., Martyrs Shrine in Midland, Marylake Shrine in King City, St. Patrick's Church [National Shrine of Our Mother of Perpetual Help], St. Theresa's Shrine in Scarborough)
  - St. Michael's Cathedral, St. Paul's Basilica
  - Churches on their Feast Days

#### • **Ecumenical Activities**

- Lent 2013 – Cardinal Collins will lead *Lectio Divina* at St. James Anglican Cathedral following Evensong
- Other Activities: major meeting with local religious leaders in the fall, Festival of Choirs on Pentecost Sunday (all details to follow) [Contact: Fr. Damian MacPherson]

#### • **Lectio Divina**

- Cardinal Collins will continue his *Lectio Divina* series from St. Michael's Cathedral monthly, beginning in September. Faith will be the main theme of this year's Scripture passages. Details can be found at:

#### • **Zone Meetings**

- Each zone will dedicate one meeting during the Year to the topic of the Second Vatican Council and the *Catechism*.

- The Permanent Deacons will have similar themes for their study days
- **Penitential Aspect**
  - The Year of Faith “provides an appropriate occasion in which all can approach the Sacrament of Penance with greater faith and more frequently.” We encourage you to promote this Sacrament as a powerful means of deepening one’s faith.
  - *Return To Me with All Your Heart* – we will aim to have this “All-Day Confessions” event during Lent 2013. Further materials and preparation aids will be forthcoming.
- **Religious Orders, Communities, and Lay Movements**
  - The various Associations and Movements of the Archdiocese of Toronto are encouraged to promote initiatives in accord with their various charisms and in collaboration their local parishes.
  - Contemplative communities “should pray specifically for the renewal of the faith among the People of God and for a new impulse for its transmission to the young.
