SAINT MICHAEL ARCHANGEL

In Hebrew, Michael means "who is like God?". Michael is mentioned three times in the Book of Daniel, once as a "great prince who stands up for the children of your people". In the New Testament Michael leads God's armies against Satan's forces in the Book of Revelation, where during the war in heaven he defeats Satan. In the Epistle of Jude Michael is specifically referred to as an "archangel". Christian sanctuaries to Michael appeared in the 4th century, when he was first seen as a healing angel, and then over time as a protector and the leader of the army of God against the forces of evil. By the 6th century, devotions to Archangel Michael were widespread both in the Eastern and Western Churches.

- * The fall of one man is a terror to others, and casts a damper on the fervor of many in the way of virtue.
- * If discretion seem to you a rare thing and hard to obtain, supply the lack of it by obedience: have recourse to that, and you will be safe.
