❖ „*Angel of Mercy*.” This new short documentary tells the story of **Sister Margaret Slachta** who defied Nazis and Communists in her fight for social justice. Slachta and the Grey Sisters are credited with saving over 1,000 lives in Budapest. Hundreds of letters of safe conduct were obtained by the sisters from the IRC, the Swedish Embassy and the Papal Nuncio. The story is told through interviews with individual survivors and helpers who had direct contact with Sister Slachta and the nuns working with her.

The documentary explores the theme that many who were saved in 1944–45, as well as those who helped them, fell victim to a second wave of terror with the Communist takeover of Hungary in 1948–49. Hungarian-born film maker, George Paul Csicsery has produced 32 documentaries on historical, ethnographic, and cultural subjects, including recent ones that explore Hungarian history and culture. He is best known for his films about mathematicians and has received several awards for his work. The film is part of the 34th annual Holocaust Education Week in Toronto and is co-sponsored by the Embassy of Hungary in Canada and the Consulate General of Hungary in Toronto.
