Pope Francis:

Go out of the churches to the streets and suburbs

The Missionary prayer intention for the month of October cannot but be in harmony with the World Day for Missions. Impelled also by Pope Francis' urgent request, the Christian faithful ought to go out of the churches into the streets and suburbs of the World, to proclaim the Kingdom of God.

Indeed, God's Word involves us not only as recipients of divine revelation but also as proclaimers of it, because Christ, the Word Incarnate, draws us and involves us in his life and mission.

The mission of proclamation is confided to everyone. So that there may be a decisive commitment to evangelization, a person and a community must really believe that 'The Word of God is the saving reality of which every person in every age has need' (Verbum Dei, 95). If we lack this real, experienced conviction of faith (and in fact this is true in so many sectors of the Church) we cannot feel the passion to proclaim it. At the most we shall be hired workers, who announce it without conviction and without spirit.

The essential condition for proclamation is, therefore, is to allow oneself to be completely involved in the event of Christ, incarnate and crucified Word of God. Missionaries must remain under the dominion of the Word, marked, as it were, with its fire, on which they must make their lives and their apostolic ministry depend. Only in this way are they equipped for proclamation. The life and mission of the Church and of all the faithful come from contemplating, responding to and living according to God's Word, and thus proclaim it.

For our time there is also need of decisive commitment to the foreign missions (*missio ad gentes*). There are millions of people that have not received the good news of the Kingdom of God. For that reason the Church can in no way limit itself to a pastoral policy of 'maintenance', but the Church and every believer must go out to all, with the power of the Spirit (cf. 1 Cor. 2:5), in a new way, to be able to communicate God's Word effectively. There is 'the need for our time of a decisive commitment to this *missio ad gentes*' (Verbum Dei, 95) and of an explicit proclamation of the Gospel. (*Fr. Vito del Prete, General Secretary of the Pontifical Missionary Union*)
