Pope Francis: Grandparents experts in faith, experts in God, experts in hope

"Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you" (Ex20:12). A people has no future without such an encounter between generations, without children being able to accept with gratitude the witness of life from the hands of their parents. And part of this gratitude for those who gave you life is also gratitude for our heavenly Father.

There are times when generations of young people, for complex historical and cultural reasons, feel a deeper need to be independent from their parents, "breaking free", as it were, from the legacy of the older generation. It is a kind of adolescent rebellion. But unless the encounter, the meeting of generations, is reestablished, unless a new and fruitful intergenerational equilibrium is restored, what results is a serious impoverishment for everyone, and the freedom which prevails in society is actually a false freedom, which almost always becomes a form of authoritarianism.

The future of a people necessarily supposes the encounter between the young and the elderly: the young give the strength which enable a people to move forward, while the elderly consolidate this strength by their memory and their traditional wisdom *(zenit.org)*.
